

## Resurrection Week Project

### Tuesday-Thursday: Prophecy and Preparation

*Matthew 21.23-25.46; Mark 11.20-13.37; Luke 20.1-21.36*

With His death approaching, Jesus condemned the Jews, prophesied coming tribulation, and His triumphant return to earth. He foretold His crucifixion, and Judas secretly arranged with Jewish leaders to betray Him. Jesus sent His disciples to prepare for the Passover...

- Tuesday: Prophecy  
*Jesus pronounces 'Woes' on scribes and Pharisees*  
*Great Tribulation, then Jesus' return to reign*  
*Call to be ready; you don't know when the end will come*
- Wednesday-Thursday: Preparation  
*Jesus foretells His crucifixion*  
*Jewish leaders plot His death; Judas agrees to betray Him*  
*Jesus got alone; sends disciples to prepare for the Passover*

### Questions for Reflection

*Why did Jesus share these prophecies just before His crucifixion?*  
*What did Jesus want His disciples – and us – to be prepared for?*  
*If you had one chance to share something with those you dearly love before you died, what would you share?*



There is so much written about events during the last week of Jesus' life, we cannot cover everything in this series of five messages. But you can! On your own, or as a family, beginning on Palm Sunday, take time to read through the events of each day from the Gospels. I have selected references below you can choose from to read each day. Note: Each Jewish 'day' begins at sundown of the day before for us (e.g., events of 'Good Friday' began on our Thursday night).

### First Day of the Week (Palm Sunday)

*Matthew 21.1-11; Mark 11.1-11; Luke 19.29-44; John 12.12-19*

### Second Day of the Week (Monday)

*Matthew 21.12-17; Mark 11.12-19; 19.45-46*

### Third Day of the Week (Tuesday)

*Matthew 21.23-25.46; Mark 11.20-13.37; Luke 20.1-21.36 (longer section; this includes the Olivet Discourse)*

### Fourth Day of the Week (Wednesday)

*Matthew 26.1-5, 14-16; Mark 14.1-2, 10-11; Luke 22.1-6*

### Fifth Day of the Week (Thursday)

*Matthew 26.17-19; Mark 14.12-16; Luke 22.7-13*

### Sixth Day of the Week (Good Friday)

*Matthew 26.20-27.61; Mark 14.17-15.47; Luke 22.14-23.56; John 13-19 (seven chapters; this includes the Upper Room Discourse)*

### Seventh Day of the Week (Saturday [Sabbath])

*Matthew 27.62-66*

### First Day of the Week (Resurrection Sunday)

*Matthew 28.1-15; Mark 16.1-14; Luke 24.1-49; John 20.1-23*
